At the outset, the Director welcomed the Chairman and members and make a power-point presentation on the activities of IGRMS. The following observations were made during the meeting.-

1. The President directed that the country needs such institution and IGRMS should be strengthened. He further advised that the IGRMS should not remain confined to its premises in Bhopal, but to enhance its visibilities. Its activities should be increased and expanded to different parts of the country including the remote and far-flung areas. He enquired about the courses offered by IGRMS and further suggested that IGRMS should make effort on the qualitative aspects of the courses. This will be a contribution of the Museum for improvement in museum field and creating job opportunities for the youth of the country. The

President also invited written suggestions from all members of RMSS for upgradation of activities of IGRMS. The IGRMS will try to include the suggestions of members in its annual activities and would achieve the target. The Ministry would help as much as possible in the execution of the programmes and activities.

- Prof. Jibon K. Singh suggested that like earlier period, the Museum may start collaborative academic programmes like seminars, workshops with different universities.
- 3. Prof. Anand Murti Mishra suggested that IGRMS should tie up/collaborate with various universities and other educational institutions including Bastar University. He further suggested that IGRMS should again start the academic national workshops like Anthropology and Museums for the students and teachers of Anthropology and related disciplines.
- 4. Prof. Sarit K. Chaudhuri suggested that IGRMS is associated with different tribal groups of India through its activities and cultural interpretation centres. But this activity was stopped due to various administrative reasons which should be restarted. The IGRMS should revive its activities to function as National Museum and plan its activities in much broader way.
- 5. Dr. K.K. Chakravarty suggested that the Ministry should seriously look into the pending problems of IGRMS such as reconstitution of Academic Advisory Committee, appointment of Director, IGRMS is known for its extension and outreach activities which should be revived again in alignment with SDG's of UNESCO. It should plan some activities keeping in mind the look East Policy of the Government. He further suggested that IGRMS must get recognization as nodal department by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt. of India for development of Tribal Freedom Fighters Museum in different parts of the country. Accordingly, the IGRMS should plan some activities. Besides these, Ministry may specially pay attention to the Govt. contribution for implementation of CPF scheme for the employees of IGRMS.
- Prof. Subho Roy suggested that IGRMS should increase its visibilities through outreach academic activities.

 Prof. A Paparao suggested that there is a good museum established by Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanam Trust. The IGRMS should plan some collaborative activities with them.

In response to the above suggestions, the Director, IGRMS said that the IGRMS will try its best for expansion of outreach activities in collaboration with different Universities/Departments and Museums according to budget and available resources. Thereafter, with the permission of the Chairman, the Director took up the following Agenda items:

Item No.3: Director's Report on Organisational Activities (Apr 2023-Dec 2023)

The Samiti noted the Director's Report of organisational activities for the period Apr.2023 to Dec.2023 with the following suggestions:

- a. The President said that IGRMS shall make tentative Action Plan for activities of its Mysore Centre. He further said that proper presentation of activities in social media platform should be taken care of. He instructed Director IGRMS to enhance social media activities by hiring professionals on contract basis who takes care of publicizing IGRMS activities at Nation level social media platform. Moreover, he emphasized on sharing important events through Ministry of Culture social media, for publicizing them across the nation. He instructed that IGRMS also make endeavour for dropping Audit Paras.
- b. Prof. A. Papa Rao suggested that physical meeting should be convened for better interaction, proper presentation and deliberations. He further said that IGRMS shall organize events focusing on Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State. He also said that grant for field visit to research students of university/anthropology to collect material culture of various cultural groups is to be given to IGRMS. The President appreciated the suggestions and assure for convening of next AGM meeting through physical mode.
- c. Prof. Sarit K. Chaudhuri suggested that IGRMS shall make endeavour for acquiring land for permanent setup and infrastructural development of its Southern

Regional Centre at Mysuru. He said that Life Time Achievement Award in Museum Anthropology which was given before Covid 19 may again be started. He also emphasized on implementation of social security scheme to IGRMS officials of the National Museum.

- d. Prof. Vijoy S Sahay suggested for collections of objects of Andaman and Nicobar region in collaboration with Anthropological Survey of India and anthropological museums of Andaman.
- e. Dr. Anand Murti Mishra said that Chhattisgarh area is the core tribal area of India. He emphasize on organizing collaborative events focusing on Tribal Freedom Fighters with Jagdalpur University.
- f. Prof. Jibon K. Singh suggested that IGRMS may plan to organizing collaborative programme with Anthropology museum of Manipur University for preservations of museum artefacts.

In response to the above suggestions, the Director, IGRMS said that the IGRMS will try its best for expansion of outreach activities in collaboration with different Universities/Departments and Museums according to budget and available resources.

At the outset, the Director warmly welcomed the President and Esteemed members of the Samiti to the 33rd AGM of RMS Samiti. With the permission of the chair,he presented the agenda for discussion and approval.

The Secretary (Culture), Vice-Chairperson of the Samiti, briefed the President of the Samiti about the resolution of the contempt case for pension benefits to IGRMS employees recruited from 15.3.1985 to 31.03.2003 and the decision of the Ministry of Culture to extend pension benefits to these employees through internal resources of the institution. The Director, IGRMS briefed about the source internal revenues and effort being made to increase the internal revenue to meet the requirement of pension. The Hon'ble Minister instructed to make a sustainable plan to address the issue.

The President of the Samiti directed to address the following points:

- RMS should prepare a plan for increasing footfall and earnings to support future fund requirements due to increased expenditures. The Joint Secretary should discuss this matter with the Director of IGRMS for the action.
- RMS may create some permanent structures like auditorium, convention hall, etc. for which the Ministry of Culture would allot additional grants under Tagore Cultural Complex and other schemes of MoC.
- 3. RMS to collaborate with therespective State Govt. for its "People of India" exhibition of different state culture and create new exhibitionsstate wise with regional focussed programmes and with a plan for 7 to 10 days festival comprising thematic cultural heritage exhibition, academic, ethnic food, performance etc., so that holistic participation of state corresponding with the RMS aim of Living Culture, accordingly inputs and grants could be received from the State Govts. The exhibition may focus on regional flavour by

adding a few more states at a time so that material cultural objects during exhibition display this will also attract other states/ regionscommunities to participate in the exhibition. In such a programme, a leading state may also be selected. It will also be helpful in cultural exchange among different states and also increase visitors' footfall.

- RMS to prepare anSOP for publicity to reach its public at large. RMS should also identify target visitors before planning the exhibition.
- 5. RMS should collaborate with ITDC, of the Ministry of Tourism, GoI, for adding RMS on their website (Incredible India, etc.), tour operator guides and also on the tourist map of India. It will be helpful in increase of visitors. President asked the Joint Secretary and Director, IGRMS, to coordinate with the Ministry of TourismGoI
- 6. RMS should make community-orientedprogrammes and activities and make efforts to organise with a thought process to meet the basic core concepts of the organisation. To increase the Global footprint,RMS should make short documentaries and videos of 5-15 min duration and engage in wider publicity for expanded outreach.
- The Secretary of MoC informed that the IGRMS would be allotted more grants to address these issues.

- 2. Prof. Anand Murti Mishra suggested that the IGRMS should plan to collaborate with Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram for the documentation of unsung tribal freedom fighters.
